# Texas oysters target of recall

**HOUSTON (AP)** — The Food and Drug Administration has advised consumers to avoid consumption of raw oysters harvested from San Antonio Bay in Texas after more than two dozen people in Maryland became ill last month.

The FDA said 25 people developed nausea, vomiting, diarrhea and other symptoms after eating raw Texas oysters at a food event in Maryland between Feb. 9-11.

Testing by the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene indicated they had contracted norovirus, the FDA said.

The virus can cause flu-like symptoms including fever, headaches and fatigue that can linger for several days, health officials said.

The oyster beds in San Antonio Bay were shut down by the Texas Department of Health Services on Feb. 24 and remain closed while the FDA investigates.

Doug McBride, spokesman for the Texas Department of Health, said Saturday that the contamination did not appear to be widespread. He said it was unclear how or where the contamination occurred.
